

The Districts Recreation Center Craft Rooms Art Display Guidelines

(Revised 12/30/08)

Purpose: To provide opportunity for Villages residents to display their art. Also gives artists the opportunity to prepare for judges shows if they wish.

Equipment: The Recreation department will provide art display brackets and hangers at each of the recreation center craft rooms – Paradise, Chula Vista, Mulberry Grove, Laurel Manor, Lake Miona and Colony Cottage.

Rules for Displaying Art

1. Each artist may hang only one piece of original artwork per center.
2. Work must be framed, wired, clean and in good condition with bumpers on the bottom (no sawtooth hooks).
3. Scrolls, quilts and gallery wraps with hanger wires or rods will also be accepted.
4. Artwork size (framed or piece) must not exceed 42” in any direction.
5. Religious, political themes and nudes are not acceptable.
6. Work to remain for 2 months – call the recreation center where art is hanging if exception is necessary. Artist will pick up work at the end of the specified time.
7. Identification cards will be made available to artist hanging their work. Cards can include artist name, phone number, art group name.
8. Work is for display only, cost of work will not be allowed on the artwork.

How To Get Art Displayed

1. Pick up and complete an Art Display application.
2. Application is to be returned to the recreation center where you wish to display your work.
3. A tracking sheet must be adhered to the back of your artwork.
4. Art is displayed at your own risk.
5. Work is accepted and changed out the 3rd week of every other month.

 - b. Paradise – Tuesday, 1-3pm – Ellen Reinhart
 - c. Chula Vista – Wednesday, 1-3pm – Nancy Dias
 - d. Colony Cottage – Thursday, 9am-12pm – Judy Adams
 - e. Mulberry Grove – Friday, 1-3pm – Bonnie Canning
 - f. Lake Miona – Tuesday, 1-3pm – Bill Main
