Villages residents are often described as "living in a bubble." But, of course, we exist in a larger community of towns and municipalities in Sumter, Lake and Marion Counties. Therefore, the VAL is striving to help through donations for our "Supporting Art In Our Community," in keeping with our By-Laws Objective "to encourage all forms of Fine Arts, and its appreciation throughout the area." Last year, at the suggestion of a Steering Committee member, we awarded \$500 to the Lady Lake Ele-

mentary School to assist their art program. As many of you know, art programs in our public schools have either been greatly reduced, or even eliminated, due to lack of funds. And many teachers are reaching into their own pockets to pay for supplies for their students.

This year we are formalizing this donation effort to get more input from our members. Last month, a committee was organized, under the direction of Co-Vice President Dianne Zalewski, to solicit suggestions from members on possible recipients for our 2018 donation(s). The committee, which also includes Marge McQueston, Vera Derk, Arrachme, and Ina Taylor, has already done much research and a lot of legwork, based on your suggestions, as well as their own knowledge of community needs.

Dianne's committee has just made final recommendations to the VAL Steering Com-mittee; who will review them, and then put their decision to a "Yes" or "No" vote of mem-

bers attending an up-coming monthly meeting (date to be announced).

These donations, once finalized, will come from the VAL general funds (mainly annual dues, not our shows' exhibitor fees). I hope you feel as blessed as I do that we are able to help support some of our surrounding communities' art programs.

Artist of the Month—Michael Pintar



My interest in the arts started as a teenager when my grandmother took me to the Pacific Ocean for an afternoon of oil painting by the seaside. Little did I know that plein air adventure would propel me into other artistic avenues for the rest of my life.

I received a degree in graphic design at Milwaukee Area Technical College. I took a job as technical illustrator, then started my own technical publishing company, got married and had a daughter. I continued to produce "nonmarketable" oil paintings and pencil portraits on the side. In 1998 work took me to Grand Rapids Michigan and I joined



the Grand Valley Artists group where I painted alongside several nationally recog-

nized artists who introduced me to pastels. I also started Aspiring Artists, an after-school drawing program for elementary kids, which grew to where I needed 3 other artists to help deliver the program to a dozen schools.

In 2002 I moved back to Waukesha, WI, and was fortunate to be represented in two galleries. I won several awards at plein air events and juried competitions. My body of work expanded to include landscape, abstract and portraiture using oils, pastels, acrylics and graphite.

I am currently teaching *Intro to Oil Painting* at The Villages Enrichment Academy. I have entered several more plein air competitions in Florida and last year won First Place at the Winter Park quick paint event. I am also grateful The Villages selected four of my paintings to be part of their permanent collection at the Village of Fenney rec center. I continue to paint for enjoyment and learning how to express myself through a variety of mediums.
