The Villages Art League will be hosting our annual fall art show on October 27th at the Eisenhower Regional Recreation Center. Please save the date for this exciting and fun event. All VAL members are invited to participate in this event: exhibiting artists and volunteers.

The fall show is our 'Fine Art' show that includes both 2 and 3 dimensional art. All art must be designed by the artist using raw materials that have been made into an art object. For example, clay made into art objects; jewelry that is made from gems, stone, glass, wire that has been cut, polished and put in the setting made by the artist and not manufactured; or wood that has been sculpted or carved into a form. Craft items are not allowed in this show.

If you are not going to be exhibiting at this event, the VAL would still like your participation. We depend on our volunteers throughout the day to help ensure that the event is a success.
