

Stained Glass Demo

Select the pattern to be used

I chose this Irish pattern called "Story Teller" because it reflects my Irish heritage. I have made several of these in this pattern. Usually I do them in green and blue with an outer edge in patterned clear glass. Cut out the pattern and attach the pattern piece to the glass.

I start by tracing my patterns on the glass.





Cut the glass piece.







Grind the glass to exactly match the pattern.



Lay the cut pieces of glass on the pattern.






Continue to place the cut pieces until all of the pieces fit.


• There are different widths and types of foiling tapes. The thickness of your glass may determine which width to use.





Wrap the glass piece with the foil strip.












The foil must be evenly distributed around the edge of the glass. Then it must be pressed down tightly to adhere to each piece.

Place the wrapped glass pieces on the pattern.


Solder the pieces together.




 Select the size of lead stripes for around the outside of your project.




 When the pieces have been soldered it should be encased in lead facing. Cut to fit and solder the ends together.




Solder the outer edge around the entire piece.










Solder "o" rings to project, add chains and "Voila!!!" Hang in your lanai!
