Artist of the Month—Fran Naughton





I have loved drawing and painting since my teacher in the first grade brought me to the convent after school and gave me chocolates to encourage me to finish a drawing I started, which won a prize in the Boston Archdiocese Art Fair. I also developed a love for chocolate!

After receiving a degree in education and art from the University of Massachusetts, I taught in Boston and New York City, and was asked to be an advisor for the Annenburg Foundation, which provided grants to schools to help implement the arts.

I also started back painting in oils with an instructor in Scarsdale, where I lived. I had been away from art for several years and enjoyed creating again. I took courses at the

Art Student League in NYC, and participated in a summer program in Aesthetic Education at Lincoln Center.







I have been on the Scholarship Committee for the Visual Art Association for several years and have been Co-President of the Villages Art League twice and am now Vice-President. It is a great club with talented artists and I'm proud to be a member.

April Program—Patricia Gilmore

Environmental Artist - Nature's Paintbox is FULL of Texture, Color. Shape & Aroma – Experience It.

Patricia is a native New Englander and multimedia artist. She has been creating art since the age of one. When presented with her first birthday cake she took one look at it and decided it was clay. Rather than eat the cake she immediately dug both hands in and and started to sculpt. Soon she moved on to mud pies, painted rocks and constructions of "stuff" that she found in the woods. Her love for 3D and texture resulted in creating body sculptures on the island of Corfu, Greece in the 1980's, body casting athletes in California and creating large marionettes and small and large fantasy characters which were sold through galleries in Cambridge, MA, Providence and Newport, RI.



In 2005 Patricia expanded her horizons to include Argentina, Chile and Uruguay. She would visit New England as a snowbird and spend the rest of her time

traveling and creating art throughout the USA, South America and Europe. Without formal studio space she found herself making art out of "stuff" that she found in nature. Many of these powerfully energetic art pieces based in sacred geometry were Earth Mandalas similar in purpose to the Buddhist monk creations made from grains of sand. The constructions are ephemeral and transient. She captures their images with digital photography. Her photographs have been juried in and sold at national art shows. She also draws and paints mandalas and lectures extensively on the history of the art form. A selection of her eco-art constructions and installations, including her biodegradable earth art dresses, can be viewed at her

Patricia facilitates several workshops including art therapy sessions that incorporate site-specific land art, multimedia composition and mindful meditation. 


