Artist of the Month—Lisa Melcher





lessons. I love living here in The Villages amongst so many talented artists. There is so much to learn from each and every one of you.








May Program—Ray Martin

The demo will compare traditional art to digital art. Also, he will demo how to create digital paintings. He will teach the steps to take from start to a finished painting.






